

Preposition Literature/Writing Activity

Rosie's Walk by Pat Hutchins ** As a writing extension, I like to allow each child/student to make his/her own book entitled _____'s Walk. The student can go anywhere on his/her walk using a preposition on each page. Illustrating and making the book brings a simple reading and writing real world element to make learning prepositions more meaningful. For older students, I ask the preposition on each page to be circled or highlighted and for the prepositional phrase to be underlined. You may also point out that the object of the preposition is typically the noun at the end of the prepositional phrase. For example, in "over the mountain," mountain would be the object of the preposition.
