

## Understanding Possessive Nouns \_\_\_\_\_

Explanation: Possessive nouns are used to show the ownership (or relationship) of objects, thoughts, or people. An apostrophe (') is generally placed either before or after an s to demonstrate this ownership.

-For regular singular nouns, the apostrophe comes **before** the "s."

**The boy's hat was on backwards.** (The hat belongs to one boy.)

**I thought Tricia's idea was fantastic!** (The idea belongs to Tricia.)

-For regular plural nouns, the apostrophe comes **after** the "s."

**The pencils' points were broken.** (More than one pencil had a broken point, and the points belong to the pencils.)

**Luis saw the birds' nest.** (The nest belongs to more than one bird.)
