

Creating Sentences with Correlative Conjunctions

Correlative conjunctions work in pairs to join together or contrast information. The first part goes at the beginning of the sentence, and the second part goes midway through.

Either and **or** go together to provide a choice.

Neither and **nor** go together to exclude two ideas.

Not only and **but also** go together to join two ideas together.

Just as and **so** go together to join two ideas as well, as do **whether** and **or**, and **both** and **and**.
